The untimely death of Dr Michael Mosley this summer reminded many of us of the uncertainty of life and the terrifying experience of the passengers aboard the Singapore Airlines flight caught in turbulence illustrates that frightening things can happen at the most unexpected of moments.

So, sit at home and hide under the duvet? Every now and again I look up wistfully at Swirral Edge on the Helvellyn range and think I would love to climb that but, either the weather is wrong, or I am setting off too late in the day. I know that even in good weather the climb is not without risk and my knees are getting stiffer by the year! Yet the attraction is still there, risks and all

People often look to faith as a great comfort but that is almost certainly a mistake. It is probably better to regard faith as a guide to how we navigate a dangerous world rather than as a safety net stopping us from ever getting hurt. The world is full of danger, risk and beauty. Life is for living, not hiding. And the story of the Bible is about people moving on, moving out, making mistakes and meeting the living God in the messiness of it all.

Jesus warns us not to be captured by wealth and comfort. To be ready for surprises. To trust in God in uncertain times. This may feel quite scary at times and we are often tempted to play safe and never try anything new or do things differently.

This summer I pray that you (and me) may discover afresh the real God rather than the God we would like to exist. The God who dares to trust us with the world and works with us and sometimes against us when we mess things up and misunderstand his purpose to change everything for the better. Have a great summer!
